# The Amagansett Seed Library

GROW YOUR GARDEN, BIG OR SMALL

## *What is the Seed Library?*

The Seed Library is a collection of seeds available for patrons to plant and grow at home. We hope some seeds harvested at the end of the growing season will be returned to the library, but that is not required. **We encourage everyone to plant a garden, no matter what level their skill.** 2022's seeds were donated by or purchased from Hudson Valley Seed Co and Seed Savers Exchange, with an emphasis on organic, open pollinated, and heirloom varieties.

## *Why is seed saving important?*

When we save seeds as a community, we help to develop seeds that are acclimated to growing in our local climate. Over time, this creates stronger plants that produce best in our particular environment. We also help preserve heirloom seeds that could be in danger of being lost to history, and our tastebuds.

## *How can I get involved?*

### CHECK OUT SEEDS

Browse our seed collection in the repurposed card catalog. Please limit yourself to seeds you will plant at home—otherwise, there's no limit! If you like, tell us what you took on the sign-out sheet.

### SAVE SEEDS

There is no obligation to save and return seeds, especially if you are new to seed saving. As you learn more and grow with us, we hope you will consider harvesting and sharing future seeds.

### DONATE

You may also donate purchased seeds if you have more than you need. Remember to look for the terms "organic," "open pollinated," and "heirloom."
